## Revelation 2:1-7

The Letters to the Seven Churches: Ephesus

"To the angel of the church in Ephesus write:

These are the words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand and walks among the seven golden lampstands. <sup>2</sup>I know your deeds, your hard work and your perseverance. I know that you cannot tolerate wicked people, that you have tested those who claim to be apostles but are not, and have found them false. <sup>3</sup>You have persevered and have endured hardships for my name, and have not grown weary.

<sup>4</sup>Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken the love you had at first. <sup>5</sup>Consider how far you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first. If you do not repent, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place. <sup>6</sup>But you have this in your favour: You hate the practices of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate.

<sup>7</sup> Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to eat from the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.

A spiritual OFSTED report?

Each of the letters to the seven churches follows a similar pattern

- 1. The recipients are named
- 2. There's a description of Jesus based on the vision in Revelation Chapter 1
- 3. There's a commendation, a complaint and a command
- 4. There's a call to listen to the message of the Spirit.
- 5. And there's a promised reward.

Ephesus gets assessed first.

Jesus highlights two key issues.

## 1. Jesus commended them for their concern for truth

This church was praised for three things

- 1. First because they worked hard.
- 2. Second because they rejected false teaching.
- 3. Third because they persevered.

And so, Jesus identified three things to comment upon. We might put it like this.

- 1. First, they were **<u>committed</u>** to the gospel
- 2. Second, they were **<u>concerned</u>** for the truth
- 3. Third, they **<u>continued</u>** in the faith

2. Jesus criticised them for their lack of devotion

So, what were they to do about it?

Jesus lays out a two fold strategy.

First, look back.

<sup>5</sup>Consider how far you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first.

Secondly, look forward.

To the one who is victorious, I will give the right to eat from the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.
