Planning Corporate Worship

- 1. The individual elements required by Scripture are
- 2. United by a **central theme** directed by the sermon passage and
- 3. Arranged in a **gospel shape** through which we walk as the service progresses.¹

- 1. Preserves the priority of preaching
- 2. Music serves the text
- 3. Transformational impact

The Gospel Shape

- $God \rightarrow Man \rightarrow Christ \rightarrow Response$
- 1. Transformational impact
- 2. Informing private worship
- 3. Transitional clarity
- 4. Purposeful variety
- 5. Gospel unity
- 6. Historical foundations

Pastoring Through a Service

Defining the role

The role of a service leader is: To **pastor** the congregation through a worship service through **intentional** use of liturgy and **thoughtful** transitions to draw people into the **gospel shape** of the service.

Making Thoughtful Transitions

"Those who lead services should indicate, without tedious explanation, why particular songs are sung and why prayers or affirmations of faith occur where they do. Why has the order changed this week and why has this new item been included? ... How will the transition be made in a way that is not artificial or manipulative? Participants should be helped to realize where the whole event is taking them, with its reading , its teaching and its responses."²
