Revelation 3:1-5 Sardis



The significance of 'name'

- Name is the word that's translated 'reputation' in (1).
- Name is the word used in (4) translated 'people'.
- And name is the word used twice in (5).

1. Jesus said they were dead (1)

"To the angel of the church in Sardis write:

These are the words of him who holds the seven spirits of God and the seven stars. I know your deeds; you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead.

2. Jesus told them to wake up (2-3)

² Wake up! Strengthen what remains and is about to die, for I have found your deeds unfinished in the sight of my God. ³ Remember, therefore, what you have received and heard; hold it fast, and repent. But if you do not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what time I will come to you.

Jesus then explains how they were to do that with a string of commands.

- 1. They were to strengthen what remains and is about to die
- 2. They were to remember what they had received and heard
- 3. They were to hold it fast
- 4. They were to repent

3. Jesus promised them life (4-5)

⁴ Yet you have a few people in Sardis who have not soiled their clothes. They will walk with me, dressed in white, for they are worthy. ⁵ The one who is victorious will, like them, be dressed in white. I will never blot out the name of that person from the book of life, but will acknowledge that name before my Father and his angels. ⁶ Whoever has ears, let them hear what the Spirit says to the churches.

Jesus promised them three things

- 1. They would be clothed in white garments
- 2. He would never remove their name from the Book of Life
- 3. He would personally introduce them to his Father

Conclusion

Here was a church

- 1. They had a reputation as being spiritually alive
- 2. They needed to repent of being spiritually compromised
- 3. They would be made spiritually secure
