## The flock of God

## 1 Peter 5:1-3

**5** To the elders among you [en humin], I appeal as a fellow elder and a witness of Christ's sufferings who also will share in the glory to be revealed: <sup>2</sup> Be shepherds of [poimainō] God's flock that is under your care [among you, en humin], watching over them [episkopeō] — not because you must, but because you are willing, as God wants you to be; not pursuing dishonest gain, but eager [to serve]; <sup>3</sup> not lording it over [gaining mastery, katakurieuō] those entrusted to you [the lots, klēros], but being examples to the flock. <sup>4</sup> And when the Chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the crown of glory that will never fade away.
