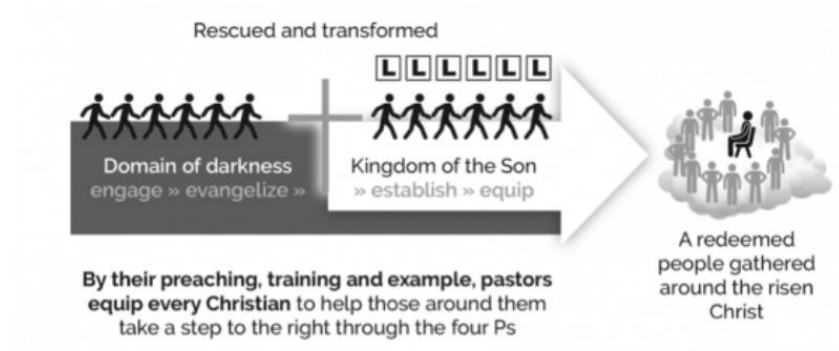

### My Plan: Helping others take a step to the right

1. Prayerfully consider who & how you might, under God, help move someone to the right.  
 2. Helping others take a step to the right will be costly and might involve a re-ordering of priorities. However, we do encourage you to be realistic.  
 The purpose of this exercise is to help shape your thinking and work at putting it into practice, not to burden you with unrealistic expectations. We've listed Person 1,2,3,4 to help you think through members of your household, not because the expectation is that you need to pick four people in each category to help take a step to the right. How you help each person will vary significantly, both in time and practice.
