2.	Don't sleep as others do because Jesus will return (1-11)
In this second	section Paul is answering the question, 'how do we prepare for the Day of the Lord?'
There are two	groups of people in this section.
First, there are	e those who belong to the darkness, who are asleep and who get drunk.
Secondly, ther	e are those who belong to the day, who are awake and who remain sober.
Why did Paul v	write this?

As Christians v	ve are to be distinct in two areas
1.	We are not to grieve like others
2.	We are not to sleep like others
